Administrative Monetary Penalties and Notices (CSA 2001) Regulations (SOR/2008-97)

Abstract: This Regulation establishes an administrative monetary penalty regime for the Canada Shipping Act and its regulations. A violation of a designated provision of the Act or its regulations may be enforceable through a fine. The Schedule to the Regulation sets forth the designated provision, the minimum and maximum amount of the fine, and whether the offender may be fined for each day the violation occurs.

[New modelling signals scale of investments needed to relieve home energy poverty \(CA-3267051-2024-04-08\)](#)

Abstract: A report urges a \$2.8 billion annual investment from 2025 to 2050 in deep retrofits for low-income Canadian households to combat energy poverty. It emphasizes the need for federal, provincial, and utility collaboration to ensure equitable access to energy-efficient solutions. The investment would boost GDP by \$6.7 billion yearly and create 16,300 jobs, while also improving home resilience and occupant well-being. The report calls for retrofit programs that alleviate homeowner burdens and recommends government alignment on goals and accountability.

[Health Canada proposes to maintain values for seven operational drinking water parameters \(CA-ESEMAG-4310653-2024-04-08\)](#)

Abstract: Health Canada's Water and Air Quality Bureau is consulting the public on a proposal to retain seven current operational parameters for drinking water. The parameters include calcium, magnesium, hardness, chloride, sulphate, total dissolved solids, and hydrogen sulphide. The proposal suggests keeping the existing aesthetic objectives for chloride, sulphate, TDS, and hydrogen sulphide, and not setting new objectives for calcium and magnesium, instead providing

guidance on managing water hardness. The consultation, which seeks feedback on the unchanged values and their development process, will remain open until May 31, 2024.
